In an effort to secure approval from regulators, including the FTC 🔑 ; and CMA, Microsoft went on to sign an agreement with Nintendo to bring the se ries to the company's future consoles. 🔑 It also came to terms with cloud gaming providers like NVIDIA.&It;/p>
