<p>The Measurement of Ski Jumps: K-Point and Beyond</p>

<p>In ski jumping competitions, judges measure jumps &#127881; from the takeoff to a reference point called the &quot;K-point,&quot; which indicates the assessment location for the distance covered by &#127881; the athlete. The following table illustrates the relationship between jump distance (in meters), K-point, and maximum landing point:</p>
